PUPPY CONTRACT

I _____, agree to the following terms and conditions set forth by the breeder.

This puppy shall be taken to a Vet within three days of purchase. The Vet will confirm health of puppy. If a problem arises, the puppy may be returned, provided documentation as to the issue from the Vet is given. AT NO TIME will the breeder issue funds towards Vet expenses or treatments of any kind.

This puppy is warrantied for the first 2 years of life against serious genetic illness that result in death, or, seriously affect quality of life. A puppy or the sale of a puppy from the breeders litter, will be issued to purchasers provided vet documentation from a licensed Vet has been given to the breeder. The breeder reserves the right to have her own Vet examine the puppy to confirm diagnosis, all documentation from the purchasers Vet will be forwarded to the breeders Vet for analysis. A puppy or sale of a puppy will be issued from the next available litter, the original puppy purchased does not have to be returned. Breeder does not guarantee sex or markings of the second puppy if issued.

This puppy has been dewormed, further treatments may be necessary. The puppy is not guaranteed parasite free, every measure has been taken to ensure sanitary conditions are maintained, but there are many parasites that a puppy can have, so proper hand sanitizing is strongly recommended until sample stool is confirmed as parasite free.

This warranty does not cover the following: umbilical hernia, undescended testicles, colour, size, parasites, or any other common non-life threatening illness.

This puppy shall not be spayed or neutered prior to 10 months of age, the hormones are necessary for proper growth and future health. Should purchaser choose to spay or neuter prior to ten months of age, this warranty shall become null and void. **PROOF OF SPAY AND NEUTER IS TO BE EMAILED TO THE BREEDER BY ONE YEAR OF AGE**, failure to do so will again, cause this warranty to become null and void.

At no time is this puppy to be left homeless, or left alone chained up outside for any reason, If the purchaser can no longer care for the puppy in the future, the purchaser is to contact the breeder directly, The breeder and the purchaser will work together at finding a new and suitable home. The breeder will take the puppy back if necessary. At no time will it be assumed that if a dog is returned there will be funds given back to the purchaser. This will be at the sole discretion of the breeder, and will be based on the length of time the dog is with the breeder, the cost of food and care, and the cost of advertising to find a suitable new home. There may also be a cost to the breeder for proper training, should the breeder find it necessary.

At no time will this puppy be considered for the purposes of breeding, again, proof of spay is required by one year of age. If the purchaser does not produce proof of spay, the warranty will be

null and void, if the breeder is made aware of attempt to breed this puppy, legal action will be set forth against the purchaser and the dog will be reclaimed by the breeder.

This puppy is to be maintained on a regular grooming schedule, of no more than 8 weeks to ensure maximal health benefits.

This puppy is to be maintained on a high performance diet for large breeds.

The purchaser agrees to the following:

- 1) Do not allow the puppy off of your property until all vaccinations are complete. A puppy will die if exposed to parvovirus, adult dogs can carry it and not be affected, they may shed the virus and leave it in the grass, the virus is very resistant and can live for long periods, if your puppy licks the affected area, they may pick it up, puppies have no immunity, and treatment is not guaranteed, more than likely your puppy will not make it.
- 2) If second dog resides in the home, limit that dog also, stay away from parks and dog parks until your puppy is safely vaccinated.
- 3) Do not allow your puppy to chew outside shoes, on the bottom of the shoes there may be remnants of the parvo virus that you have tracked in.
- 4) Do not allow excessive running, jogging etc, nor should you allow running up and down the stairs repeatedly. Large breeds grow at an incredible rate, their hips can and do get damaged from too much running as a puppy or too much stair use. If your entire house contains hardwood flooring, make sure you puppy has a softer area to spend time on, such as an area rug. Too much standing on hardwood floors may also cause hip problems later in life.
